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# The rewards program that started me seeking out organic products ends today.

This program played an important part in my weight loss/maintenance journey. It was kind of like discovering SP and both happened in 2009 when I finally got serious about eating healthy.

I'm not a milk drinker, but I do like yogurt – lots of yogurt. In the old days I bought whatever was on sale, but over the years yogurt changed. Many were almost like desserts.

By chance I discovered the Stonyfield Company. Originally it was my thriftiness. I bought a 32 oz container which happened to be on sale. Then I noticed the "organic" label and made from milk from "hormone free" cows. I also liked the taste and that no artificial sweeteners were included.

With quart containers I began blending more of the plain and Greek varieties into my favorite "French Vanilla" flavor further reducing the sugar content.

The lids told me a little about the company's history and their "rewards program."

On their website I recorded the codes of the products that I bought and earned points which I redeemed for free stuff. Did I mention that I'm thrifty?

Since today is the last day of the program I checked my account and realized that since 2009 I got the following FREE:

15 quarts of yogurt

7 pints of Greek yogurt

27 individual cups of yogurt

1 pint of frozen yogurt

A jar of natural peanut butter

A subscription to Organic Gardening magazine

An "environmentally friendly" towel

and donated a bunch of points to worthy causes

I estimate my rewards were worth about \$150. Over the course of 4 years that's not a huge amount of money, but I learned a lot along the way – how animals are treated, the amount of time they spent outdoors, what they are fed, antibiotics, pesticides, hormones and other issues.

I'm sorry to see the program end, but nothing lasts forever. I'll still visit the website for the coupons and recipes and check on issues of the day.

Full disclosure: The company is owned by Dannon and there is concern that since the Stonyfield president has left to work full time on the "Label it" campaign (re: GMOs), that the product may change.


And I am sorry I missed the program, it sounds like it has been a great reward for eating and choosing the healthier choice.


