The Day After

Thursday, August 27, 2015

Thank you friends for your expressions of concern regarding yesterday's shooting in my little town. If it had not been reporters killed live on camera during an interview, 2 more violent deaths would not have made the national news.

It was so strange to see the overhead maps projected to show viewers where the tragedy occurred. I could almost see my house!

I remember when "going postal" made its way into our vocabulary as a term to describe a "disgruntled former employee" killing co-workers. That's reportedly the case in this incident. You're mad about something, so grab a weapon and take lives.

Once the killer was cornered and took his own life, I ventured out. The road to the bridge was still closed. I did my errands in the other direction. The Post Office was empty, only 1 employee, no customers, even the flag pole was bare - very eerie.

This area made national news for a tragedy once before. We are about an hour away from Virginia Tech. Remember that massacre? One of the reporters was a 2011 graduate. All 3 of my children are graduates also.

When I met my newly discovered relatives in Europe for the first time, I was explaining where in the USA I lived. I mentioned Virginia Tech. Did they hear about the shooting at the school?

They replied "which one?"



Sad when a location becomes known for tragedies. In 1966 a sniper at the Univ of Texas tower (main building) killed 14 people and wounded 32 others before being killed himself. A year later I worked in one of the quad buildings below the tower and professors in our department pointed out all the bullet holes on the exterior of the historic building and the Graduate Advisor I was secretary to spoke of pulling victims into the building. Another secretary in the building had been the one pinned behind a flagpole base during the entire incident.

When I was being introduced at my new workplace in 1972 in NC, many people immediately made comments about that incident and asked if I was there and/or did I know any of the people. I listened to a live radio broadcast and when it was over, knew 3 of the 14 killed (high school classmates who were visiting the campus) and 2 of those wounded (friends of my parents).
