Her death was one of THREE in my family within 11 days. My cousin Lorraine was 74. My cousin Vasil was 90, but I only met him in 2008

That's when my search for "roots" or HOME took me to Slovakia and the village of my grandfather who died in 1935 on a visit there. Vasil told me that I have his "spirit" of learning and exploring new things. I liked that. This is Vasil and me at our last visit in Bratislava last summer.

With apologies to our great poet, I think of home as the place where, when you go there, they WANT to take you in. Vasil and family warmly welcomed their "surprise" cousin from America - the only grandchild of grandfather's 2nd family.

Thank you Spark People for your support these past weeks. I love my virtual home.

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
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
